Fundraising to help critically ill children

Over the past 20 years, Loma Linda University Children's Hospital (LLUCH) has helped kids with many life-threatening medical emergencies, having served 1.2 million children in Southern California, including critically ill or injured children from the Coachella Valley.

Approximately 5,000 Coachella Valley children received life-saving medical care at LLUCH in 2012. The hospital partners with Coachella Valley hospitals, transporting children by ambulance and helicopter for specialized services not available at local hospitals.

Almost 15,000 children are admitted to Children's Hospital each year. An additional 120,000 receive care through the Pediatric Emergency Department and its Outpatient Clinics. More than 30 percent of children transported to the Pediatric Intensive Care Unit at Children's Hospital are residents of desert communities, a statistic that many people are not aware of, with the exception of parents of these critically ill children.

This is due in part because Loma Linda's Pediatric Emergency Department is the only Level 1 Trauma Center in the region. This Level 1 Trauma Center helps kids with the most serious, life-threatening medical emergencies, and also offers one of the biggest and most advanced neonatal centers in the world, taking care of the tiniest babies.

Big hearts for little kids

"Their goal was to build a support base for the hundreds of Coachella Valley children who seek treatment for serious inpatient and outpatient medical issues at Loma Linda University Children's Hospital each year.
